The Department of Corrections works with every offender upon entry to obtain a valid residential address. This effort is voluntary as the Department cannot force an individual to supply this information. Subsequently, if an individual supplies post office boxes, shelter or halfway house addresses, multiple addresses due to homelessness, or addresses that conflict with Nevada Offender Tracking Information System (NOTIS) those addresses cannot be verified and validated by the State Demographer's office.

Earlier this month, the Department of Corrections began working with the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Motor Vehicles to match offenders in their database to verify the remaining unknown addresses. Health and Human Services encountered similar challenges as the Department of Corrections but has been able to help make strides in validating additional addresses. The final results of these additional efforts will be turned over to the State Demographer's office expeditiously.
